Presenting Keynote Speaker Dr. Kelly K. Browning, Executive Director of Impact Teen Drivers

For the past 25 years, Dr. Kelly K. Browning has served as a leader for youth and parent programs that prevent risky behaviors and unintentional injuries through improving positive decision making. As Executive Director of Impact Teen Drivers, Dr. Browning aims to increase evidence-based education regarding the dangers of reckless and distracted driving so that people make better decisions behind the wheel—whether as drivers or passengers—to keep our roads safe for everyone. Dr. Browning is particularly adroit at uniting diverse groups of stakeholders for a common cause, and has combined the efforts of first responders, health professionals, educators, parents, the insurance industry, transportation agencies, and other government, corporate, and non-profit organizations to promote a unified

message and evidence-based practices to tackle the number one killer of teens in America. Using a multifaceted approach to change the driving culture to one that is distraction-free, Dr. Browning and Impact Teen Drivers hope to save thousands of lives needlessly lost on our roadways every year. Dr. Browning received her Ph.D. in Criminology from the University of South Florida, her Master of Public Health in Criminology from the University of Central Florida, and her Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice from the University of Minnesota, Moorhead State.
