## Richard Kaywood Memorial Award

Beginning in 1985, and each year thereafter at the annual ADTSEA conference, an award is presented to an individual for outstanding contributions to traffic safety in memory of Dr. Richard Kaywood, who served the Association and traffic safety education for many years. This award is sponsored cooperatively with AAA Traffic Safety.

Dick had a long and productive career, beginning with his work in safety education as an assistant professor of health and physical education at the University of California at Santa Barbara. In 1955, he became the multi-school chairman of driver education in the Anaheim Union High School District. In 1965, he became an associate professor of driver and traffic safety education at California State University at Long Beach. He went on to become a full professor and coordinator of safety and driver education. During his last three years, he also served as interim chairperson of the health science department.

Throughout his life, Dick was a tireless worker and strong advocate for quality driver and traffic safety education programs. Dick Kaywood's life exemplifies the spirit of the words inscribed on the Richard Kaywood Award medallion: Outstanding Contribution – Driver and Traffic Safety Education.

He also worked with the Illinois High School and College Driver Education Association. Dr. Francis Kenel was a mentor to many driver education teachers. He authored materials on teacher training and beginning driver education. Dr. Kenel was a constant resource to the ADTSEA staff, officers, and members.
