NATIONAL STUDENT SAFETY PROGRAM

The National Student Safety Program (NSSP) was created in 1956 by the National Commission on Safety Education, which was a part of the National Education Association. In 1970, leadership of NSSPwas reverted to the American Driver and Traffic Safety Education Association (ADTSEA). ADTSEA, anon-profit organization, became the parent organization.

NSSP encourages student organizations/schools to participate, plan, and conduct projects, events, and activities that promote highway safety education, prevent drug, tobacco, and alcoholuse/abuse/prevention, and provide accurate, up-to-date information and education regarding health and other issues that impact teens. An annual summer teen leadership training conference is held to provide students with an opportunity to network with other students from across the nation, exchange ideas, and to highlight outstanding safety programs and projects.

NSSP activities are coordinated by the ADTSEA office located in Indiana, PA.

MISSION AND GOALS

The NSSP mission is to reduce injuries and save lives by encouraging and assisting students to initiate and implement safety activities within their respective schools and communities. NSSP fosters awareness that there is a problem on our nation's highways, and students have the power to unite against the growing menace of highway fatalities.

The purpose of NSSP is to:

- stimulate interest in the conservation and enhancement of life through safety promotion;
- focus the attention of youth groups on the need for and benefits of co-curricular;
- provide a supportive network for teens to make safe and healthy lifestyle choices.

The NSSP goals are to:

- highway/traffic safety activities;
- empower students with encouragement, resources, and the leadership skills to carry out constructive and continuing highway/traffic safety programs in their schools and communities;
- provide leadership and a channel through which students can express their thoughts and ideas concerning safety and the well-being of human life.

The awards committee is composed of ADTSEA members. They will serve as judges and reviews each nominee for award categories 1, 2, and 4. All judges will review award category 3 nominees.

Each school group submit one nominee per award category 1, 3 & 4. Groups may submit up to 5 community safety projects per school. Each nominee's documentation evidence must have the official NSSP nomination form attached. Nominations should be submitted to Mrs. Jennifer Brown by July 24, 2022. You are able to submit entries at registration.

AWARD CATEGORIES AND CRITERIA

Category 1 - National Safety School/Club/Group Award

These awards recognize the combined group elements and activities that support a broad, sustained and successful year-long youth safety school/club/group.

A perfect score is 100 percent.

Three levels of distinction are recognized:

- Gold level for 20 to 25 points (1st, 2nd, 3rd place top awards from this category)
- Silver level for 14 to 19 points
- Bronze level for 8 to 13 points

Rubric:

- 3 (Excellent Rating: Performance indicator demonstrates an exceptional understanding/quality/quantity/variety/commitment/participation. Personal excellence is the ability to demonstrate a thorough understanding of the project for all performance indicators)
- 2 (Proficient Rating: Performance indicator demonstrates a basic understanding/quality/quantity/variety/commitment/participation. Personal proficiency an understanding of the projects performance indicators but lacks the skill level of the excellent category)

1 (Needs Improvement Rating: Performance indicators demonstrate limited understanding/quality/quantity/variety/commitment/participation. Member/Group needs improvement in the understanding of the projects performance indicators)

Category 2 - National Community Safety Award

These awards recognize a community safety project, event or activity that supports the NSSP vision and portrays a positive role model for the community.

A perfect score is 100 points.

Three levels of distinction are recognized:

- Gold level for a 90 to 100 percent (1st, 2nd, 3rd place top awards from this category)
- Silver level for a 80 to 89 percent
- Bronze level for a 70 to 79 percent

Rubric:

- 3 (Excellent Rating: Performance indicator demonstrates an exceptional creativity/planning/implementation/follow-up/involvement/participation/community benefit. Personal excellence is the ability to demonstrate a thorough understanding of the project for all performance indicators)
- 2 (Proficient Rating: Performance indicator demonstrates a basic creativity/planning/implementation/follow-up/involvement/participation/community benefit. Personal proficiency an understanding of the projects performance indicators but lacks the skill level of the excellent category)
- 1 (Needs Improvement Rating: Performance indicators demonstrate a limited creativity/planning/implementation/follow-up/involvement/participation/community benefit. Member/Group needs improvement in the understanding of the projects performance indicators)

Nominees must submit a nomination form and at least three letters of recommendation that include a description of how the nominee demonstrated the criteria for the respective category.

- School and community involvement
- Leadership
- Dedication and reliability
- Student in good standing (drug-free, uses safety belts, no motor vehicle violations)

National Advisor of the Year

- Facilitation of student empowerment
- Reliability and commitment
- Motivational ability

Category 4 - Best in T-shirt Design

These awards recognize the marketing efforts of teens in promoting NSSP's mission with T-shirt designs.

An entry shall consist of the T-shirt and a short summary of the objectives of the design. A perfect score is 25 points.

Three awards will be given to the three highest scores as 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners.
